Young Leaders



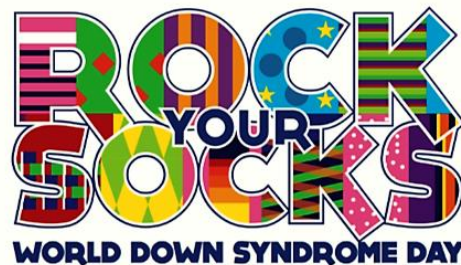

Parking outside School

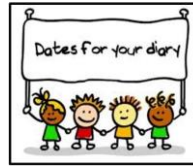
